Democracy:

Children are involved in Democratic processes, for example all the pupils vote for the School Council in properly set out voting booths. The School Council is led by Mrs Martin, who is part of the school's 'Personal Wellbeing & Cultural Awareness' team.

The Rule of Law:

We have a clearly structured behaviour policy which all stakeholders understand and follow. We regularly review behaviour incidents in school and share these with key stakeholders. Assemblies are delivered with a focus on the law, for example safety awareness, E-safety awareness and Anti-bullying.

Individual Liberty:

Children have key roles and responsibilities in school, such as children in Key Stage 2 taking on roles of Prefects/Head Girl and Boy/Peer Mentors/buddies/Librarians and the Lunch Bunch. Through our curricular clubs and opportunities, children are given the freedom to make choices. Within school, children are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment.

Mutual Respect:

Respect is embedded within our whole school ethos within our Superhero reward system: Captain Respectful, Resilience, Resourceful and Reflective.

Tolerance of those with Different Faiths and Beliefs:

We have visitors from various faiths who share their culture with our pupils, for example two days of Diwali workshops.
