School Uniform Policy

1 Introduction

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.

2 Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- creates a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be a distraction in class.
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is designed with health and safety in mind.

Generic sweatshirts, cardigans and polo shirts in the school colour of Royal Blue are acceptable as part of the school uniform.

Please ensure all items of clothing (including shoes, socks and trainers) must be clearly labelled with your child's name. Please check visibility of the label regularly.

3 Jewellery

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are:

- one ear stud per ear
- small objects of religious significance
- a simple analogue or digital watch. Pupils are not permitted to wear Smart Watches or other similar style watches. Many of these have internet connectivity and cameras, which if used within school could pose a safeguarding risk.

We ask the children to remove these objects during PE, games and swimming. Please do not have any ears pierced during the school year.

4 Hair/Make up

Hair should be reasonable and appropriate for being in the learning environment at school. The school does not permit children to have 'extreme' haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. Hairstyles and haircuts which are deemed extreme include hair that is dyed an artificial colour and hair that has any sort of pattern shaved into it or excessively gelled to encourage the hair to 'stand up'.

Hair accessories such as bobbles, head bands and hair slides should be in school uniform colours. Where hair is braided, coloured beads or strings should not be worn. We ask that if children have these done whilst on holiday, that they are removed before the return to school.

Children are not allowed to wear make-up, nail varnish or false nails in school. If children do have nail varnish on or false nails for a holiday or special event please remove before returning to school.

A final decision upon the appropriateness of hairstyle will be made by Mrs Mole, Headteacher. Where a hairstyle has been deemed unsuitable, we will expect it to be rectified.

5 Tattoos

Any form of tattoo is not permitted, other than those that are part of a religious or cultural celebration. If this is the case, then please put this in writing to Mrs Mole, Headteacher.

6 Second Hand Uniform Shop

The school operates a second-hand uniform shop every Monday afternoon after school – please ask at the main reception for information

As parents you have the right to choose which school your child attends. Once you have chosen that school you and your child have the responsibility to follow the rules and guidelines of the school. All parents who send their children to our school must support the uniform and hair policies. Parents have a duty to ensure that their child has the correct uniform at all times and is sent to school correctly dressed.
